Prerequisite Course Policy

- Each prerequisite must be completed with a minimum 'C' grade.
- Only one grade of 'D' or 'F' is allowed within the eight prerequisite courses (to be repeated)
- CR/NC grades are NOT accepted (excluding Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate)
- First course taken in each category with a grade of "C" or higher will be counted.
- Online, web-based, or distance learning science and laboratory courses taken at other institutions must be approved by the School of Nursing.

Application Process

Students are **not** allowed to apply with courses in progress. All eligible applicants must be declared Pre-Nursing in order to apply to the program.
