☐ Step 1) Ve	erify That You Are In the Correct Major/College For Your Career Goals

wl	your major is not listed then contact the <u>Dog Days Office</u> to change to a day here your correct major is represented. Note: Pre-Medical programs are pically within the College of Science and Math.
☐ <b>Step 2)</b> Ad	ccess and Save Your Appropriate Major Advising Sheet/Roadmap

Scroll down to your major of choice, click the opdown panel, and select the top most link to access a fillable PDF version of our advising sheet. <b>Print or save a copy</b> on your computer/tablet to utilize uring the academic requirements presentation during your Dog Day.
☐ Step 3) If Applicable, Fill in Exam Credit or College Classes Taken During High School	
sc (G th	or AP, IB, or CLEP Exams, this link will show credit earned for passing scores; roll down to the appropriate exam, find what course and General Education (E) area the passing score counts for, and fill this in on the GE sheet attached to e advising sheet you downloaded earlier. Note: If you are waiting on test scores ake a note of where the area might clear if you feel you passed the exam.
eq AS	or college classes taken in high school, courses that seem similar typically are quivalent (e.g. College English likely clears the GE English requirement). Use SSIST.org to find equivalents or schedule an appointment with an ACDC punselor after your Dog Day to verify those course equivalencies.
☐ <b>Step 4)</b> M	ake Sure You Have Access To Your Student Portal
re <sub>i</sub> en	eing able to access your Fresno State portal (my.fresnostate.edu) is critical for gistering at Dog Days. Your Username will be the first part of your student nail address. If you forgot your username or password <u>use this link</u> or contact e Tech Services desk <i>prior</i> to your Dog Day.

☐ Step 5	Familiarize Yourself with the Class Search and Wishlist	
0	While it is not necessary to plan your course schedule prior to Dog Days as we will review major requirements and the class search with you, familiarizing yourself with the system can be helpful. The following link is a brief guide on how to search courses by subject or by area, which can be added into your "shopping cart" prior to your orientation date.	
0	<b>Note:</b> Students cannot enroll into courses until the end of their orientation date.	
☐ Step 6) Check Your Wishlist for Any Duplicate Courses		
0	As a courtesy, Fresno State "block schedules," or provides all new students with 2-3 courses in critical areas (e.g. Writing, Math, etc.). As such, you may already be enrolled in a number of courses prior to your orientation date.	
0	Since High School transcripts/test scores are still being processed it is common for these courses to be duplicates of completed courses. By utilizing this guide you should be aware of what areas you have already completed, and <b>it is imperative you double check for duplicate coursework.</b> If you are enrolled in an area you already have completed (e.g. ENGL 10 after completing AP English) or don't need (e.g. BIOL 10 for Nursing/Exercise Science majors) be sure to drop that course during the registration component of your Dog Day.	
☐ Step 7) A Few Other Things		
0	If you are part of a special program on campus (e.g. EOP), keep an eye out for communications regarding additional opportunities they have for you.	
0	Be sure to submit any high school or college transcripts by June 30th, 2024	
0	Financial Aid is highly specific to you, so for any questions regarding the FAFSA it is best to contact <u>their office</u> prior to your Dog Day	
0	We also recommend bringing the following:
