# **B.A. Social Work Program Description**

Students pursuing a baccalaureate degree in Social Work enter the university as freshmen in the Pre-Health major, or apply directly as transfer students for the Social Work program. Pre-Health students begin the Social Work program in the Spring semester, while transfer applicants begin the major program each fall semester.

# Prerequisites for Entry into the B.A. Social Work Program

Pre-Health students interested in the SWRK program must successfully complete admission requirements and apply at the beginning of the third semester, and will begin courses during the fourth (spring) semester. Transfer students must apply directly to the SWRK program and, if admitted, will begin in the fall semester.

- 3. Senior year internships are arranged by the field coordinator; required applications and interviews must be completed in the semester prior to beginning field placements
