

The Importance of Sibling Connections: Exploring How the Child Welfare System Affects Sibling Bond & Social Development

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Abstract

This study sought to explore experiences of individuals and their siblings who were impacted by Child Welfare Services. Despite policies in place to maintain healthy sibling connection, child welfare systems need more structure to maintain sibling bonds. Volunteer participants consisted of 10 female individuals who identified as former foster youth. Thematic analysis was utilized to identify four themes that emphasized the detriment that the child welfare system has on sibling connection and social development throughout life.

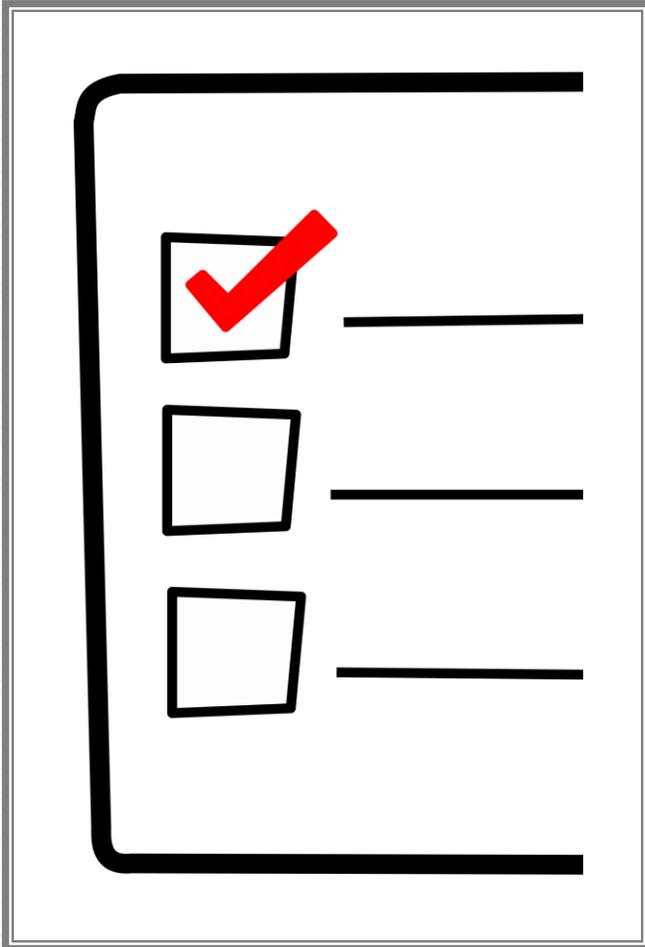

Methodology



- Semi structured qualitative interviews
 - 13 questions
- Sampling
 - Purposive
 - Snowball
 - 13 questions
- Thematic Analysis

Participants

Resourced Volunteer Participants from:

- Santa Clara County - The HUB
- MSW Program

Diverse population of volunteers:

- African American
- Native American
- Mexican American
- Bi-Racial
- Caucasian

- Never separated vs limited to no sibling contact
- Adopted

Purpose and Significance

The goal:

- To explore the impact of the loss of relationships
- Study the importance of sibling impacts
 - Social Development
 - Maintained vs. Separated

The reason:

- Understand the need for further development to California WIC §16002
- Explore social work mandates, practices, and knowledge for adjustment
- Explore the importance of defining active efforts to maintain sibling relationships

Research Question

How does the child welfare system impact sibling relationships and social development throughout life?

Between siblings:

- Separated without contact
- Siblings with maintained contact
 - Reunified

Evidenced by:

- Impact on Self-Identity
- Impact on social development
- Impact on future relationships as an adult

Conceptual Theoretical Framework

- Erikson's Psychosocial Theory
 - *8 stages of personality development throughout the course of life*
- Social Role Theory
 - *Behaviors dictated by societal expectations*
- Identity Theory
 - *Sense of self comprised of components such as role, self-esteem, age, ethnicity, etc.*
- Attachment Theory
 - *John Bowlby's theory about adaptable connection styles in important relationships*

Findings

Themes derived from thorough analysis lead to finding four overarching themes:

- Severed bonds
 - *Youth's development impacted by loss of important bonds*
- Loss of self-identity
 - *Removed and forced into different roles that were not present at birth*
- Who to trust?
 - *With social worker's setting the tone, siblings being pinning blame on each other, who can youth trust?*
- Adapting to new setting
 - *Adjustment to forced expectations; survival instinct*

Who to Trust?

Key questions:

- Who to trust?
- How to form trustful bonds when relocated numerous times?

Key points made:

- 5/10 participants reported that social workers avoided the discussion of siblings
- Social workers & foster parents did not provide easy communication with siblings
- Parentified individuals advocating and being shutdown

"...with her, I'm not that close. We have periods of being close. So ... I don't want to get too close to other people because then it's like - I don't want to deal with other people..."

Severed Bonds

Key points:

- Guilt, jealousy, uncertainty, loneliness and distrust
- Filling in the void
- Uncertainty in current relationships

"there is this element ... 'what is it about me that you didn't want me to be around?' ... and think it goes back to, maybe even being separated from my sister. And what was it about the family that wanted her and didn't want me...? I think there's some insecurities around relationships sometimes, right?"

The Loss of Self-Identity

Key findings:

- Sense of purpose
 - Self-isolation
 - Abandonment
 - Loneliness
 - Depression
 - Overwhelmed
- Roles:
 - Parentification, caretaker, outsider, etc.
- Teenagers
- Adoption

"...I wanted a sense of belonging, and a sense of like - wanting to know who I was and where I came from."

"... it made me miss him when we got separated, I missed him, and it made me feel more lost..."

"The separation from my siblings, and the strain from my siblings and other family members as well, allowed me to let the world tell me who I was, rather than knowing who I was. "

Adaptation

Key findings:

- Avoidant of social interactions
- Multiple roles
- Different locations
 - Group homes
 - School

"... but I'm very good at pretending enough to care about them to where I seem normal, and so I fit in with that group."

"I think it's being a chameleon, moving around so much. Learning how to adapt, right?"

Recommendations

Key findings:

- Empathetic and genuine social workers
- "higher minimum"
- Sibling days
- Education on parentification
 - *Social worker*
 - *Care provider*
 - *Court system*

"They make us feel insignificant when we've had to grow up at a very young age. So, it's like, why are you treating me like a child?"

Recommendations (cont.)

Partnerships with community resources:

- Foster Love
- The HUB
- Third party visitation centers
