Half the Sky by Nicholas D. Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn; 2009. This book written by Pulitzer Prize winners tells the plight of women in the world. The authors wrote of the many atrocities still being leveled on young girls and women. To many men in the world, females are not seen as being equal and are used by men at their pleasure e.g. Rape, prostitution, child kidnappings and forced marriages. Young women are also sometimes abused by their own mothers or older females. The authors were able to interview individuals who had been victimized and shared their stories throughout the book.
