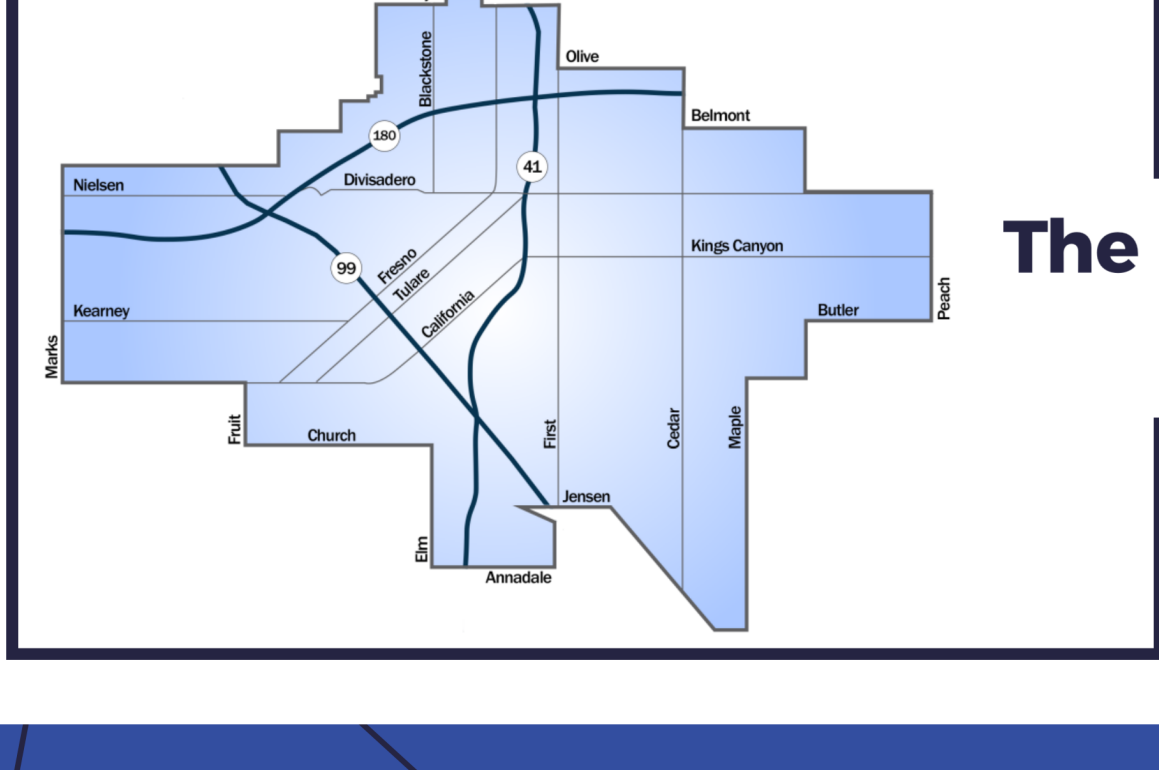

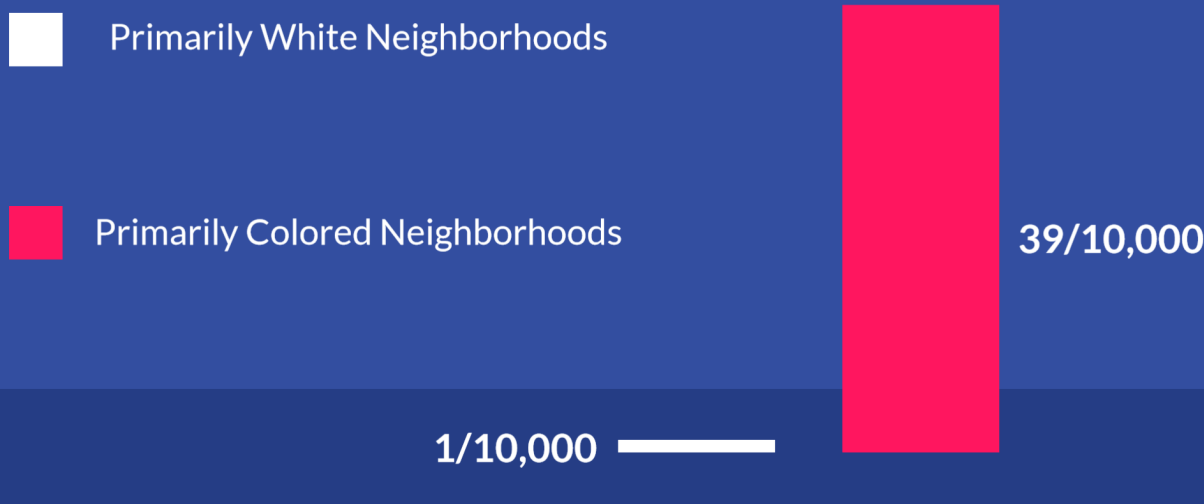
The Place

Hospitalization Rates



Neighborhoods with higher concentrations of People of Color and Higher Levels of Poverty have significantly **HIGHER** Rates of Diabetes and Mental Health Hospitalizations

Hospitalizations in Fresno County



Neighborhoods with higher concentration of Whites and Lower Poverty Levels have significantly **LOWER** rates of Hospitalizations



Income Levels



25% or more of families with children have incomes at 125%
