Your Zip Code Matters, Because Where You Live Impacts How You Live

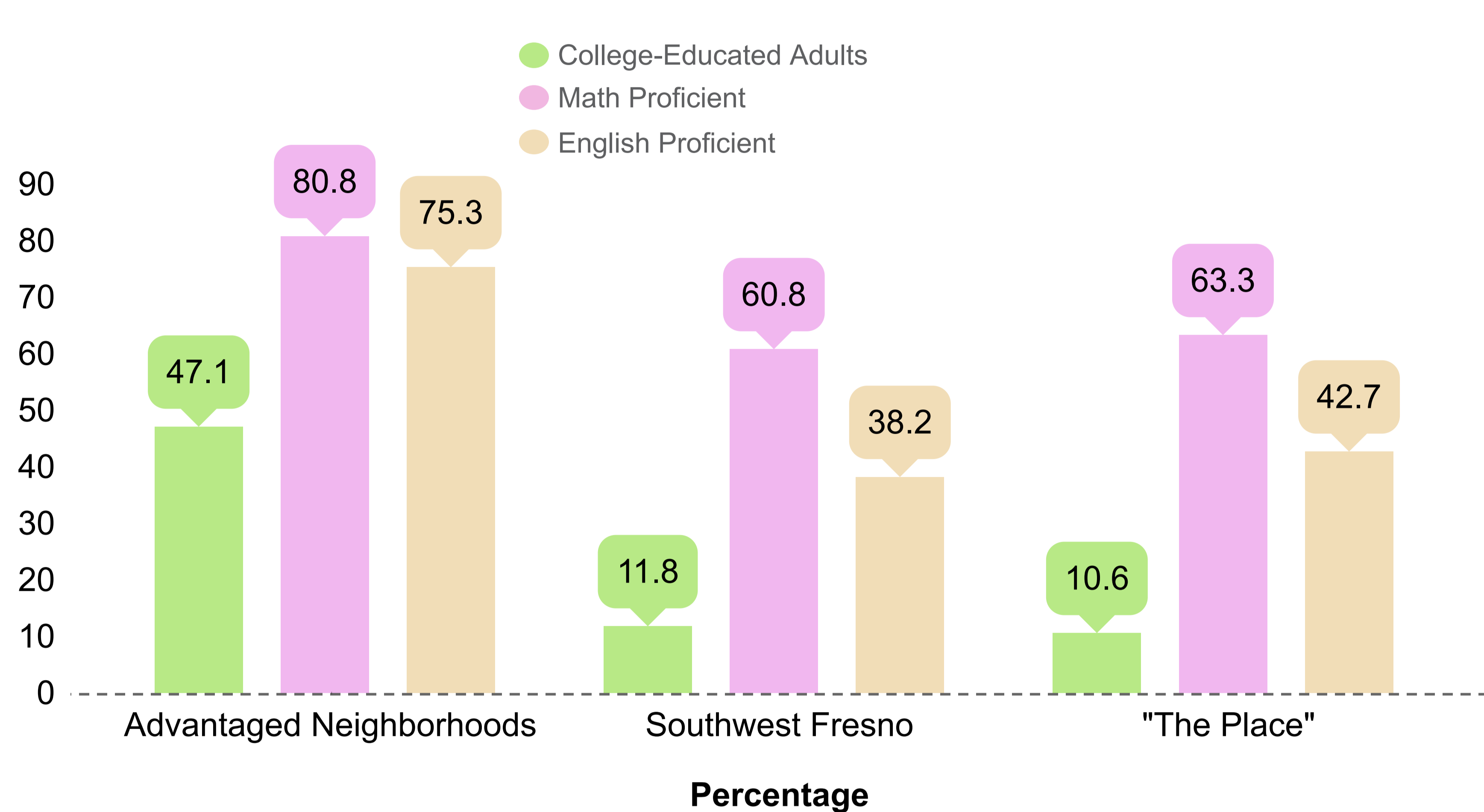
Access to education and resources for student success are crucial for prosperity. In Fresno, not everyone has the same access to the resources they need to be proficient and ready to achieve social mobility while others in Fresno are thriving.

## Education

For the 2016-2017 school year, 74% of education spending meant for low-income, English language learners, and/or foster youth students allocated to all students instead.

### PROFICIENCY

Not only are there more math and English proficient students in Advantaged Neighborhoods, but there are nearly five times more college educated adults in Advantaged Neighborhoods than Southwest Fresno or "The Place".



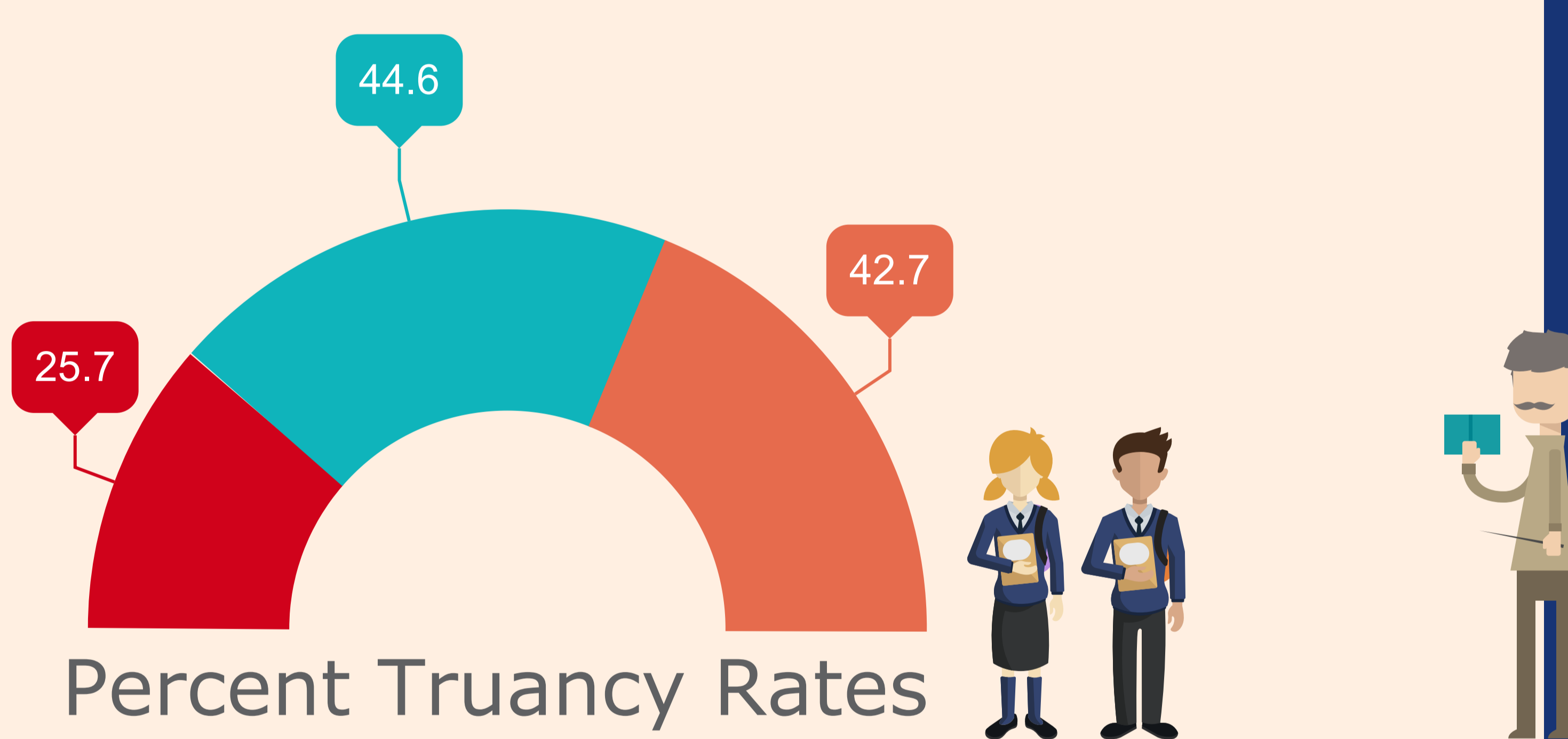
### ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TRUANCY RATE

#### What is "truancy"?

Truancy is when a child is absent from school for unjustified reasons.

The number of students missing school in Southwest Fresno and "The Place" is nearly doubled that of Advantaged Neighborhoods.
