SJV CHIP

The goal of SJV CHIP is to reduce the cumulative health impacts of environmental pollution in the communities of the San Joaquin Valley.

Long-Term Goals

- Ensure regulatory agencies and elected officials understand health impacts from multiple sources of pollution and adopt enforceable regulations that will reduce cumulative impact.
- Train community members who are empowered to speak out about the effects of multiple pollution sources on their health and communities.
- Support/develop credible, scientific research that documents the cumulative health impact of multiple types and sources of pollution.
